We'll bless backpacks and send our children and teachers off with a special blessing on September 11th and we're starting up Sunday School on September 18th. And on the 25th of September, we're kicking off what will be a fall emphasis this year, "The Church has Left the Building." You'll read more about these things in this newsletter!

But I want to start with what I hope can be a special emphasis for all of us this fall, and that's for us to consider INVITATION—that God is inviting us to be renewed and refreshed in our faith-relationships; that we are called to invite others to join us in ministry and witness to Jesus; that we are invited to respond to those in need around us.

One of my colleagues, in responding to a question about Evangelism and the Doctrine of Election, recently asked church leaders around the country to consider that "in Christ, God has always, already chosen us," and that everyone that we meet "has always, already been chosen by God for grace and for goodness."

What if we are especially chosen by God, in Christ, to be agents—not just of worshiping on Sundays and learning lessons in Sunday School—of inviting others to experience the love and grace of God that we have? What if we are agents, not meant to tell others how to believe, or to try and get others to believe as we believe, but instead, are simply called to invite them to participate in the joy and justice of the gospel with us?

So we're trying to set up our Fall Season as a time of "invitation." Hoping that the members and friends of our congregation will be invited to participate both in worship and in witness. AND, hoping that our members and friends will seek to INVITE OTHERS to simply join us in worship and witness. It should include some Sundays, but also some things we do together beyond Sundays.

You can check out some of what this means in this month's newsletter as we look forward to hearing the impact of some of our mission activities this summer, learning how far our mission work reaches, inviting you to consider helping us working among the community and for others. And the way to do that is with our love, our prayers, our hands and work, our blessing and commitments to share. And we're going to do this together, as a whole congregation, as we participate in the Church has Left the Building.

So, come on back. The door is open, wide. We're inviting you to experience a new emphasis where we try and make the walls around us disappear, so that others can see our work and witness and love of Jesus. It's not just that we've left the doors unlocked and are waiting for others to crack them open and come in. It's that we're thinking of ourselves as people who have already been chosen by God—in Christ—and who are equipped for ministry together. We want the world to see us, and be invited to join us!

None of this is easy. But we have Jesus to show us the way. See you in Church!

MISSION NEWS

Over the year, we've been working on re-thinking Mission as a way of understanding our role in the community as church members. As part of the "New Beginnings" program, we've seen how important ministry to the community is as a way to express our commitment to the Gospel, and as a way of strengthening our ties with each other. The Mission team embarked on a "Total Mission Project" this year to assess how our Church and its members touch others in the community through mission, taking all giving together. Some of the results are displayed in the Sanctuary of the church in the form of more than 40 posters that show where Mission giving of the church is directed in the Delaware Valley, in addition to where individual giving and serving is making a difference in the local area. Thanks to all those who volunteered information about the organizations and programs they have been supporting. Take a look at all that we have done as a church and a body of believers acting out of love. Our commitment to "bearing each other's burdens" can clearly be seen. In the next month, we'll be posting a new set of images showing where Church and individual contributions and service are being received beyond our region and around the world.

In this same light, the New Beginnings groups found some new ways to strengthen this mission focus in addition to our substantial service to the Connect by Night program in the winter months. In late July, a group of from Llanerch Presbyterian members met with members of Christ Community Church to prepare a meal for the guests at the Life Center on 63rd Street. CCC (formerly Riverview Presbyterian) has been serving at the Life Center on any 5th Saturday of the month for many years. After a brief prayer, the inter-church team rustled up soup, salad, bread and dessert for approximately 200 people. The cooking team finished as the transporting and serving team gathered to make the delivery to the waiting guests. The daily Life Center meal is open to all, and leftovers are distributed as extra portions for family members at home. The fellowship between church members, with our church partners, and with the guests, was a special exhilaration. We're looking at another opportunity to serve on October 29, so keep posted.

Thanks to all in the large group who participated in this experiment in outreach (6 bakers, 5 cooks, and 7 servers). Thanks also to all who donated socks that went to the guests at the Broad Street Ministry under the care of Rev. Andy Greenhow. (Those socks had walked away on happy feet by the end of Monday.) Thanks to all who donated food for the Food Bank at Chester Eastside Ministry. (September donations will be dedicated on Sunday the 18th!) Finally, thanks to those who participated in the church's summer Red Cross Blood Drive. More than 20 units of blood were collected (in our air-conditioned annex in the Haverford Free Library!)

HEY? WHEN'S THE STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN?

So, Hey! Welcome back to Church! We hope your summer was fabulous, and we're excited about church programming and we hope you are, too. By now, you've heard about several things happening this fall, and one of the things you won't hear a lot about is STEWARDSHIP. It's not because we've stopped believing stewardship is important—it really is! It's because we think there's a better time to talk about giving to God and in particular, giving to our congregation—but it needs to be at a time when we aren't overwhelmed with “back to school” and inviting people to participate in new activities and programs.



Know that we ARE THINKING ABOUT STEWARDSHIP. But we're going to talk about it in January, rather than the fall. Yes. We know that's a big change. Session considered carefully what it means to break the tradition, but acted believing there was a better way of talking about stewardship and giving at a different time.

The Church Has Left the Building is coming! ...Say what?

Have you heard about “Church has left the building?” There’s been a little confusion, so let’s clarify. “Church has left the building” is a way of describing a DAY OF SERVICE in which our congregation is committing to, in lieu of a traditional worship service. The idea is that rather than remaining committed to Sunday worship, we give up one Sunday as a way of connecting with other people and the world around us by serving in ways that look like and honor Jesus.



This doesn't mean we're going to stop worshipping in church. This doesn't mean we are going to abandon our church building. It means that on ONE SUNDAY (November 6th), when you come to worship you'll be invited to participate in SERVICE PROJECTS in and for our community. You'll hear more of this as we describe the program in detail starting on September 25th. We'll spend October looking forward and getting ready for the day of service. And then, on the Sunday of Service (November 6th) you'll come to the Church in order to be dispersed in teams to your service locations. We'll have an opening prayer and blessing for our service, and we'll gather together to celebrate, share stories, and share a meal together in the afternoon.

Other churches have tried this and liked it; so we're joining a number of churches in our Presbytery, including our friends at Beverly Hills Presbyterian Church in participating in 2016. The Theme will be "Inside out... set your faith free." We'll begin exploring what this means for our life together as we talk about specific plans and details later this month.
